Born in Cleveland, Ohio, in 1932, he made his theater debut there at the age of ten. Since then, he has put in outstanding performances as a singer, a dancer, a nightclub entertainer and a brilliant light and dramatic actor in films, television and the legitimate theater.

Mr. Grey's stage and screen performances in "Cabaret" won him both the Antoinette Perry ("Tony") Award and the Academy Award for Best Supporting Actor, as well as widespread critical acclaim which continued with his later

starring roles in the Broadway musical "George M!" and the film "Man on a Swing".

Besides leading a busy entertainment career, Mr. Grey is also a devoted family man, living with his wife, Jo, and their two children, Jennifer and Jimmy Rico, in New York City. In 1973, along with then Vice President Gerald R. Ford and several other prominent Americans, he received the "Father of the Year" award. Mr. and Mrs. Grey are both enthusiastic art collectors, specializing in contemporary American and African works.
