A Michigan wine will be used at President and Mrs. Ford's dinner tomorrow honoring the Chancellor of Austria, the first time a wine from the Midwest has been served at a State dinner.

The President and Mrs. Ford have been serving domestic wines from California.

The wine, Tabor Hill Trebbeano 1971, will be one of three wines served. It is a white wine produced by the Tabor Hill Vineyard and Winecellar in Buchanan, a city in the southwest corner of Michigan.

The vineyard was established in 1968 by Leonard Olson, 32, who is president of the company. He and his family planted the first vines in 1968, received their winery license in 1970 and sold their first bottle in 1972. They produced more than 24,000 gallons of wine this year.
